## **Digital Rights Management Options within MediaCAST**

During the 4-step upload process, a variety of tools are available to help users with digital rights management. The steps involved in loading a media resource to the MediaCAST portal include:

- 1. Selecting the media type
- 2. Inserting metadata to make files easily searchable
- 3. Digital rights management
- 4. Uploading the file

As can be inferred by the name, step three is where users can select from options designed to protect their digital rights. These options include setting an expiration date on media files, limiting simultaneous user, password protecting content, setting group restrictions and using the advanced fair use compliance tool. A screen shot of step 3 can be seen below.

Options for setting expiration dates, requiring a password and limiting users can easily be found under the *Expiration* and *Access Control* sections of the page. However, the options for setting group restrictions and using the Advanced Fair Use Compliance Tool can be a little trickier to find. These options are located on the right-hand side above the box for setting an expiration date.

Setting group restrictions can be useful when a resource is not appropriate for all age groups. For example, you might have a video of a frog dissection that is great for high school biology students, but you wouldn't want your third graders viewing this video. For materials with sensitive materials, consider adding group restrictions. When the option for *Group Restrictions* is clicked, you will be taken to a screen that looks like this:

Before restrictions can be used, they must be turned on. This can be done by clicking **Turn On** at the end of the text. Once restrictions have been activated, the following screen will appear. Simply select the groups you want to allow access to, and click **Add Access for These Groups**. Once group restrictions are turned on, only the groups listed under **Available To** will be able to see the media file in search results.

To use the *Advanced Fair Use Compliance Tool*, simply click the link from the main Step 3 page and you will be taken to a questionnaire regarding the resource. Answers given to the questions will generate a score based on which column the answers fall under, Favoring Fair Use or Not Favoring Fair Use. This score can be found at the top, right-hand side of the page labeled *Current Fair Use Index*.
